1. Run (*Daudna*) : He runs in Marathon.
Ran : He ran in Marathon.
Ran : He has run in Marathon.
2. Believe (*Bharosa Karna*) : He believes in religion.
Believed : He believed in religion.
Believed : He has believed in religion.
3. Hold (*Pakadna*) : He holds market.
Held : He held market.
Held : He has held market.
4. Write (*Likhna*) : He writes articles.
Wrote : He wrote articles.
Written : He had written articles.
5. Sit (*Baithna*) : He sits in a temple.
Sat : He sat in a temple.
Sat : He had sat in a temple.



PHRASAL VERBS

1. Drop Off. (*Chhodna*): I have to **drop** my sister **off** at work before I come over.
2. Drop In. (*Kisi ke yahan achanak jana*): I might **drop in** for tea at your house.
3. Draw Out. (*Vistarit karna*): **Draw out** the training itinerary to improve my English.
4. Eat Out. (*Hotel mein khana*): I don't feel like cooking tonight. Let's **eat out**.
5. End Up. (*Parinaam swaroop pahuchna*) : We **ended up** renting a movie instead of going to the theatre.
