VERBS

1. Push (*Dhakka Dena*) : We push a truck.

Pushed : We pushed a truck.

Pushed : We have pushed a truck.

2. Weep (*Rona*) : I weep for her.

Wept : I wept for her.

Wept : I have wept for her.

3. Beat (*Marna*) : They beat a robber.

Beat : They beat a robber.

Beaten : They have beaten a robber.

4. Ring (*Bajana*) : You ring the bell.

Rang : You rang the bell.

Rung : You have rung the bell.

5. Blow (*Phukna*) : Drivers blow the horn.

Blew : Drivers blew the horn.

Blown : Drivers had blown the horn.

PHRASAL VERBS

1. Hand Out. (*Vibhajan*): We will **hand out** the invitations at the door.
2. Hang Up. (*Samapt karna*): He didn't say goodbye before he **hung up**.
3. Jack Up. (*Upar uthana / kimaten badhana*): Shopkeepers **jack up** during festivals.
4. Keep On. (*Jari rakhna / Yaad dilate rahna*): **Keep on** boiling until the milk comes to this line.
5. Kick Out. (*Niskashit karna*): My company has **kicked out** one of the lazy staff last week.
